If you were to overhear someone talking about A.I., you'd probably assume they are talking about "Artificial Intelligence," but I want to invite us to talk about a different A.I. – "Appreciative Inquiry." This is a method of curious group exploration where we focus on the strengths and successes within our community. Rather than dwelling on any deficiencies, Appreciative Inquiry encourages us to identify and build upon what is already working well. As a church, this may help us recognize where the Holy Spirit is already moving among us, both personally and collectively.

The process of Appreciative Inquiry typically involves four key actions: (1) Discover, (2) Dream, (3) Design, and (4) Deliver. For now, I only want us to focus on Step 1 -Discover. Reflecting on our past experiences, let's identify the moments when we have felt most alive, connected, and inspired within our church community. Over the next two months, I invite each of you to participate in this process by <u>sharing</u> <u>your stories, experiences, and reflections on what makes our church special to you</u>. Whether it's a cherished memory, a meaningful interaction, or a particular aspect of our ministry that has touched your heart, I want to hear from you via email, an office visit, or a phone call throughout the months of June and July.

As the new guy, I foresee that your participation in this process will help me experience (if only vicariously) the amazing depth of God's work in this church. And as the seasoned participants in this congregation, your participation can help unlock new insights, deepen our connections, and co-create a future that reflects the best of who we are and who we aspire to be.

Thank you for your enthusiasm and dedication to Christ's mission through the church. I look forward to embarking on this exciting journey of curiosity, exploration, and discovery with each of you.

70th ANNIVERSARY REDEDICATION OF THE STAINED GLASS WINDOWS

For the first 25 years of our "new" sanctuary, the church only had plain glass windows all around. But one of our long-time members, Mrs. Lisle Horton (ridiculously in those days married women were only identified by their connection to their husbands!) wanted a stained glass window to be installed as a Memorial to her late husband. The idea caught on and the project grew to encompass replacing all of the windows in the main building.

As the years passed the window sections slowly began to deteriorate. So the congregation decided that all of them should be restored to their former glory. The project took about ten years to complete, one window at a time. Finally, in 2023 the final window was reinstalled.

Now, on the 70th Anniversary of the original installation in 1954 (the 95th Anniversary of the sanctuary), we will have a Rededication Service of the newly refurbished windows on June 9 during our regular church service. Pastor Stephen will also be speaking over the course of several Sundays about the various themes in the windows (Fellowship, Baptism, Communion, etc.). So mark your calendars and plan on attending **the June 9 Rededication Service** to join in celebration. Jesus is The Light of the World – and His light shines brightly through those windows!

Historical Reflections: Golden Guys and Gals Concert

The Golden Guys and Gals gathered together on May 9th to enjoy Mary Schecher's musical talents. When we arrived, we received a program, just like attending a Milwaukee Symphony concert.



The song selections were great. Mary got a true work out, especially during the 1862 "Battle Hymn of the Republic." Most of us view the organ as a large keyboard instrument. However, there are three tiers of foot pedals that dramatically add to the sound and workload.

Mary's feet moved faster and longer than most soldiers did at the 1863 Battle of Gettysburg!

After the music, all 16 of us traveled to Steak House 100 (73rd and Greenfield) and enjoyed great food and conversation.
